I feel the need for speed.

here aren't too many topics you can bring up that cause so much angst as the topic of broadband and internet speed. At conferences, we all end up comparing upload and download speed with our fellow communities and wondering why there's such a vast difference. How much is enough?

According to the Texas Broadband Development Office¹, if you're doing a lot of things on multiple devices simultaneously (gaming, downloading files, streaming video, video calling, streaming music, checking e-mail and searching the internet), you need at least 500—1,000+ Mbps. The Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's) benchmark for high-speed internet is at least 25 Mbps for downloads and 3 Mbps for uploads.

What does it all mean?

Let's get some terms out of the way. When speaking of broadband, we mean always-on, high-speed internet access usually delivered by fiber, but it can also be delivered wirelessly.



Just like water and electricity, we often speak of broadband as a vital part of modern life especially after the pandemic.

Why such a hot issue?

Some inventions start out as luxury items for the very rich, like those that had the first radio or telephone. Over time, the price comes down and more can afford it. Then it turns into oxygen—we must have it in order to enjoy an even and fair playing field in terms of jobs, technological opportunities and education.

Experts have warned that the digital divide (those that have access and those that do not) is deep and lawmakers are working on combatting barriers to broadband access by passing legislation to make broadband more accessible to Texans.

House Bill 5, established the Texas Broadband Development Office¹ (Housed in the Continued on p. 2

Texas Comptroller's Office) and one of their many goals is to establish a long-term, statewide plan that addresses strategies for expanding access to and further adoption of broadband service. Offering grants to internet service providers (ISPs) is part of the plan, so that explains the increase in ISP's entering the market. Once these grant funds are awarded, they have a finite amount of time to get fiber in the ground or on a pole.

How does this affect you and your business?

Businesses already talk about their desire for more speed and reliability when it comes to broadband. Whether you have a highly technical business or you have a retail store internet is vital for payment processing, accessing customer data or online sales. Glenn Hegar, Texas Comptroller, conducted a Broadband Listening Tour which included a survey of Texans asking them to share their broadband experience. They received over 16,000 responses—results are below.






Project Kuiper—Amazon's Answer to the Broadband Mix

Gerard Kuiper is considered to be the father of modern planetary science. The Kuiper Belt, a region of the solar system that exists beyond the eight major planets, is named after him.

Project Kuiper is a new initiative for Amazon to

provide fast, affordable broadband to communities around the world that are currently unserved or underserved by traditional internet and communications options.



They plan to launch 3,232 satellites into space into Low Earth Orbit (LEO) - which means they will be placed from 367—392 miles above the earth. This initial satellite constellation design will group these similar satellites to work together with tightly coordinated movements, which will provide reliable broadband coverage. This close proximity to earth's surface means they can deliver fast connectivity.

The project started in 2018 with research and development, and the U.S. FCC granted a license to Amazon in 2020. They've already launched proto-



type satellites with 100% success and expect to begin deploying in early 2025. Commercial service to customers will roll out later in the year.

Pricing has yet to be determined, but Ama-

zon says that affordability is a key principle of Project Kuiper. In terms of speed, they expect their ultra-compact model to provide speeds of up to 100 Mbps, the standard model to deliv-

er up to 400 Mbps and their largest model to deliver up to 1 Gbps.




New and Updated Demographic Data

It's sometimes hard to gauge Quality of Life. However, this is an important aspect of our community that attracts employers and job seekers.


