### The Secret Worth Sharing—Burton's Newest Non-Profit is Set To Share It

Tucked along quiet roads just off the beaten path, there's a town most people aren't aware of as they pass by on Hwy 290. Burton, with its rural charm and history, has long been one of Texas's best-kept

secrets. Once discovered, this little town leaves people wanting to explore more.

This secret is soon to be out with Burton's newest non-profit: *Destination Burton Association*, a freshly minted nonprofit with a simple but powerful mission — to share the magic of Burton with the world.

Bryan would've needed to spend an extra \$5,500 just to keep their economy humming. That's the power of tourism.

And the state is paying attention. Gover-

nor Greg Abbott has launched the Tourism Friendly Texas Certified Community program — an initiative that gives towns across Texas the tools and recognition they need to grow through tourism. He already recognized Brenham for its efforts. calling it a model for local economic development.



#### **CREATING EXPERIENCES**

The idea behind Destination Burton is more than just promoting a place. It's about creating experiences, building partnerships, and generating economic growth by inviting others into what locals already know — this town is something special.

Tourism isn't just a passing trend. It's a lifeline that fuels small towns across the state. Just look at our neighbors.

In 2024, *Destination Bryan* welcomed a staggering 4.8 million visitors. Without that influx of travelers, each household in

#### THE BEAUTY OF BEING DISCOVERED

But here's the part that really makes hearts beat faster: people aren't just traveling anymore — they're *seeking*. They're hungry for stories, simplicity, and soul. They crave authentic experiences that reconnect them with nature, heritage, and hands-on creativity. That's where Burton shines.

Whether it's exploring the historic Texas Cotton Gin Museum — home to the oldest operating cotton gin in America — or strolling through a guided *Soundwalk* that whispers stories of Burton's past, visitors are invited to slow down and step into a living history.

Nearby gems like **Deeply Rooted Ranch** and **Milk and Honey Ranch** offer guests the opportunity to roll up their sleeves and reconnect with the land, animals, and traditions that define rural Texas life. This is **experiential tourism**, and Burton is with local businesses, short-term rentals, and nearby attractions to turn Burton into more than a stop — but a true experience.

Social media campaigns and a future website will help tell the story. Grants and state programs will help fund it.

## **Work Experience Programs**

#### **Work Experience**

Work Experience was created as part of Workforce Solutions commitment to building a strong, stable, and well-trained workforce while addressing the labor challenges of the 21st century. Our Work Experience Program is a year-round program for job seekers trying to get back into the workforce. Its purpose is to provide valuable and meaningful experiences to trainees in order to help prepare them to obtain permanent employment. We do this by collaborating with local businesses, like yours, who are willing to mentor and train local candidates. Employers who agree to partner with Workforce Solutions Brazos Valley are asked to host an employee for eight weeks. Workforce will underwrite the cost of this training program enabling businesses and candidates to focus on achieving training proficiently without financial concerns for either party. In other words, we will pay all the wages for eight weeks and carry a liability insurance on each participant.



#### On the Job Training (OJT)

On the Job Training offers participants an opportunity to earn as they learn, while employers benefit from a partial wage reimbursement during the training period. OJT focuses on jobs that involve new technologies, production, service, or additional skills for full-time positions (30 hours per week is considered full-time) paying at least \$14.00 per hour or more. Advantages to the employer include:

- No cost access to a carefully screened pool of available talent
- You set the qualifications, interview, and select the individual

- Customized training your way, at your workplace
- Receive up to a 75% reimbursement of the new employee's wage, up to \$21.00 per hours, while they are training (up to 1040 hours and based upon targeted occupation)
- Simple process with minimal paperwork

We partner with employers in various industries and locations throughout the 7-county region and offer a team of specialized recruiters to help match skill sets and positions.

OJT is only available for new employees, and training information must be established prior to the start date, so don't delay, and contact us before you hire!

#### **SEAL Program**

Our Summer Earn and Learn (SEAL) Program was created as part of the Workforce Solutions commitment to build a support system for students with disabilities. Our purpose is to provide our SEAL participants with meaningful work-based experiences that will develop them into strong workforce candidates in the future. We also provide participants with eight hours of Job Readiness training prior to their start date of the five-week summer program. Vocational Rehabilitation will ensure participants have any devices or job coaches needed to achieve job skills proficiency. Workforce will underwrite the cost of this training program enabling businesses and candidates to focus on achieving training. We will pay all the wages and cover the liability insurance on each participant.

#### Workfare


A work-based activity that consists of placement of job seekers with a public or private nonprofit entity in an unpaid job assignment.

When the programs end the business can hire each candidate(s) they train. Our long-term goal is to assist all candidates in obtaining permanent job placement with a company that can utilize their skills while allowing them to meet or exceed their personal goals.







